- To contact you with educational events to help you in the event of fire
- To inform San Diego Animal Services and Community Animal Response Team (CART) if animals are left behind.

Your name, Address, Telephone contact numbers (including cell), email address, types of animals and quantities of each type; and whether you have a trailer and an evacuation plan or not.
